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Governors Inslee's Executive Order 16.09

- ▶ Governor Inslee's Executive Order 16.09 (Issued 2016):
 - ▶ Goal 1: Prevent inappropriate opioid prescribing and reduce opioid misuse and abuse
 - ▶ Goal 2: Treat individuals with opioid use disorder and link them to support services including housing
 - ▶ Goal 3: Intervene in opioid overdoses to prevent death
 - ▶ Goal 4: Use data and information to detect opioid misuse/abuse, monitor morbidity and mortality and evaluate interventions

Statewide Opioid Response Plan

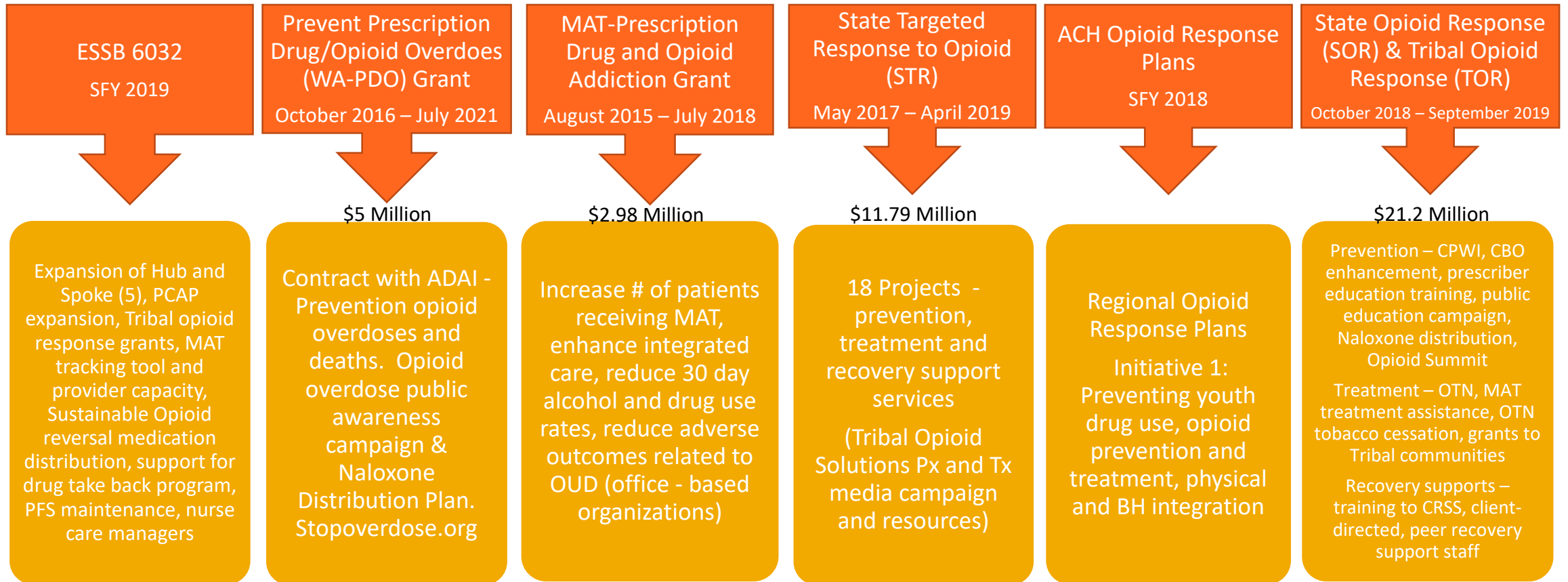
(Goal 1. Prevention, Goal 2. Treatment, Goal 3. Coordination, Goal 4. Evaluation)

- ▶ The Washington State Interagency Opioid Working Plan includes four priority goals: Focus areas are on individuals, professionals, communities, and systems.
 - ▶ 1. Prevent opioid misuse and abuse.
 - ▶ 2. Identify and treat opioid use disorder.
 - ▶ 3. Prevent deaths from overdose.
 - ▶ 4. Use data to detect opioid misuse/abuse, monitor morbidity and mortality, and evaluate interventions.

Tribal Opioid Response Workgroup

- ▶ *Purpose:* The Tribal Opioid Workgroup is a project funded by the State Opioid Response (SOR) plan in collaboration with Tribal leaders through the SOR roundtable and consultation process. The purpose of the establishment of the Tribal Opioid Workgroup will be to assess gaps and resources for the spectrum of OUD affecting American Indian/Alaskan Native individuals and Tribal communities in Washington State. The objectives of the workgroup are to develop goals and objectives that will inform the Statewide Opioid Response Plan and provide overall direction for Tribal programs to address the prevention, treatment, and overdose of opioid use disorders in the AI/AN population.
- ▶ Proposed Project Plan:
 - ▶ Coordinate with State Opioid Response Plan leads (DOH, HCA-DBHR, HCA)
 - ▶ Consult with Tribes on project contract
 - ▶ Coordinate participation of Tribal leaders to participate in workgroup
 - Send DTL
 - Present at IPAC quarterly/subcommittee, AIHC board meetings, NPAIHB meetings
 - ▶ Workgroup Development
 - Set meetings (4-6 meetings)
 - Develop mission/vision and charter
 - Determine need for and conduct needs/resources assessment
 - Develop goals and objectives
 - Develop milestones and timelines
 - ▶ Work with Statewide Opioid Response Plan leads
 - Provide recommendation on goals/objectives during Statewide Opioid Response Plan annual update FY 2019
 - ▶ Present work to Tribal leaders
