Unplanned Pregnancy in Washington




35%

Pregnancy planning is linked to a number of **positive health outcomes for women, babies and society**.

Planned pregnancies are more likely to receive **prenatal care** and have adequate **birth spacing**, which **reduces** the risk of **low birth weight** and **preterm birth**.


The Problem



The most effective methods of birth control – **long-acting reversible contraceptives (LARCs) such as the IUD and the implant** – are considered best-in-class by **the CDC, American Academy of Pediatrics, and by OB-GYNs** who choose these methods for themselves more than any other.

Yet **only 30%** of community health offer access LARCs in a single visit.

The five biggest barriers to single-visit birth control access:



Lack of trained providers

Screening for pregnancy intention

Issues billing, coding and stocking LARCs



Results: Delaware


Simulated **15% decrease** in **unplanned pregnancies** among Title X patients in Delaware



Source: Child Trends, 2018 — % of female Title X clients age 20-39, excluding those reporting abstinence or pregnant/seeking pregnancy, and those whose method was unknown. Analysis focused on simulating the decline in unintended pregnancy, and results do not assess how much of that decline is attributable to Delaware CAN.


